



D/C Michael P. Scher, AP has called a District 17 council and conference to be held during the period of 19-21 March 2010 beginning with registration at 1300-1800 on the Delta Queen Steamboat located in Chattanooga, TN.

Article 3, Section 3.1 of the District 17 bylaws states: “The Council shall be composed of the elected bridge officers, the immediate past Past District Commander or the most recent Past Commander willing to serve, the chairman of the General Committees, and the Squadron Commanders, which persons shall be the voting members of the Council.”

Article 4, Section 4.1 of the District 17 bylaws states: “The Conference shall be composed of the Council, the past district commanders of the district who are active members of district squadrons, and the delegates, which persons shall be voting members of the Conference.”

Article 4, Section 4.2.1 further states: “Delegates shall be selected by each squadron from that squadrons active members on the basis of one delegate for each 25 active members in good standing, or major fraction thereof, as of the preceding 1 March, with a minimum of two delegates per squadron.”

Article 4, Section 4.2.3 states: “Prior to each meeting of the Conference, each squadron commander shall submit in writing to the district secretary a list of the squadron’s delegates entitled to vote at such meeting.

Article 5, Section 5.7 states: “At any meeting of the council, 50% of the members of the council shall constitute a quorum. At any meeting of the conference, 25% of the members of the Conference shall constitute a quorum.” “At any meeting of a committee of more than two members, a quorum shall be a majority of its members.”

Located in downtown Chattanooga, Tennessee, the Delta Queen Hotel is the last fully operational, overnight passenger paddle wheel steamboat in the country. After logging over two million miles on inland waterways, she was brought to her current dockage on the Tennessee River at Coolidge Park Landing in February 2009. Permanently berthed, she now provides overnight accommodations in the traditional southern style hospitality of the riverboat era. As you cross the gangplank your step back into time guarantees a relaxing and enjoyable weekend aboard a vessel that exemplifies the unique atmosphere of an historic period when the sound of the flowing water is broken only by the merry sound of the steam calliope.

Room choices are King, Queen, Double or Two Single beds. Rooms are located on the main and upper decks, determined by your choice of beds. The cost is \$70.00/room plus applicable taxes.

The Grand Staircase from the Main Deck leads to the Texas Lounge while dining is on the lower level in the historic, finely appointed Orleans room. Being registered in the National Marine Hall of Fame, the boat does not have elevators and is not handicap accessible.

A complimentary breakfast is served to all overnight guests at no additional cost.

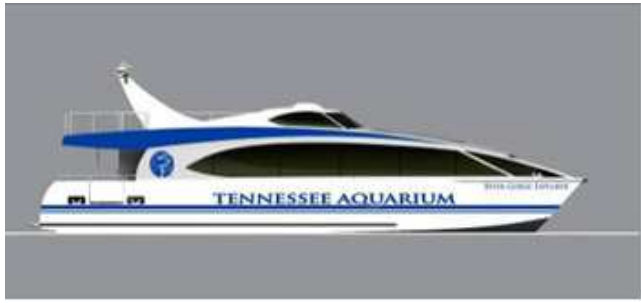
